Safeguarding Policy
Statement 2022

In accordance with the Church of England Safeguarding Policy, the Parish Church Council of St Luke-in-the-City, Liverpool is committed to promoting a safer church.

In order to meet this commitment, the Parish Church Council of St Luke-in-the-City, Liverpool (the PCC) will:

- Appoint two named Parish Safeguarding Officers (PSO) to work with the incumbent and the PCC to implement policy and procedures.
- Display in church premises and on the Parish website the details of who to contact if there are safeguarding concerns or support needs.
- Safely recruit and support all those with any responsibility related to children, young people and vulnerable adults within the church.
- Respond promptly to every safeguarding concern or allegation.
- Care pastorally for victims/survivors of abuse and other affected persons.
- Care pastorally for those who are the subject of concerns or allegations of abuse and other affected persons.
- Respond to those that may pose a present risk to others.
- Ensure that health and safety policy, procedures and risk assessments are in place, and that these are reviewed annually.
- Ensure there is appropriate insurance cover for all activities involving children and adults undertaken in the name of the Parish.
- Review the implementation of the Safeguarding Policy, Procedures and Practices at least annually.

This policy applies to the PCC and all Parish Officers.

The PCC appoints Rose Green and Sue Say as the Parish Safeguarding Officers.
